Following the passage of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), the Integrative Healthcare Policy Consortium (IHPC), in partnership with the Institute for Integrative Health, Palmer College of Chiropractic, and Bastyr University hosted an invitational conference at Georgetown University to develop and assess implementation strategies of parts within ACA relating to complementary and alternative medicine. Gregory Goode and Dr. Moira Fitzpatrick will report on the strategies discussed as well as the current opportunities and challenges for CAM (Complementary & Alternative Medicine) during this implementation phase.

Gregory Goode serves as Executive Director of Government Relations for Indiana State University. In that capacity, he serves as the University liaison to the Indiana General Assembly, Governor’s Office and Commission for Higher Education as well as the United States Congress and local governments. From 2009-2012, Mr. Goode served as Chief of Staff to the President of Bastyr University and was the founder and director of the University’s Center for Health Policy and Leadership. Mr. Goode has a lengthy history of direct involvement in higher education, healthcare, and transportation public policy issues, having worked in Washington, DC for two members of the United States House of Representatives. He is the former Public Policy Chair of the Integrative Healthcare Policy Consortium and currently serves on the boards of the Maple Center, Terre Haute Regional Hospital, and the Hamilton Center Foundation as well as the Public Policy Council for the Terre Haute Chamber of Commerce. He earned two degrees from Indiana State University including a B.S. in Political Science and M.A. in History. He is a PhD Candidate in Public Administration and Policy at Virginia Tech, writing his dissertation on the social movement of naturopathy.

Moira Fitzpatrick, PhD, ND is dually licensed as a Clinical Psychologist and Naturopathic Doctor. Dr. Fitzpatrick has practiced psychotherapy for over 25 years, serving both the seriously mentally ill and individuals, couples, families and communities. Dr. Fitzpatrick has an entrepreneurial spirit, started numerous businesses, is the former vice president of Bastyr California and has developed the art of birthing new programs. She facilitates the growth of cohesive teams in support of visioning, co-creation and the evolution of ideas. Dr. Fitzpatrick is currently a part of the team creating a model integrative medicine clinic in La Jolla, California.
